Currently, the company has 8 dancers and 7 apprentices. Under Rita Mustaphi's direction, KDT has shaped the Kathak landscape for 36 years preserving Kathak dance & pushing the form's boundaries in an effort to make innovative, inclusive works.

Kathak Yatra - The Journey of Kathak Dance of India

Kathak Yatra offers the viewer a glimpse of the evolution of Kathak dance throughout India's historical eras & its contemporary rendition! Starting from the ancient temple period, through the royal courts of the kings & the emperors to today's stages!

Kathak, this storytelling art form, has its origin in the narrative tradition of the village minstrel who sang songs of heroic tales & dramatized their lyrics with subtle gestures & expressions. Rhythmic footwork, fast pirouettes & complex movements characterize this graceful spontaneous dance. Later, the art came from the temples to the royal courts & represented a unique synthesis of both Hindu & Muslim cultures. Kathak expresses abandon, yet it also carries a reticence that offsets this flamboyance and creates charm that is simply irresistible.
